#### Our contracts will aim to:

- **Energy**: reduce the direct electricity, gas and fuel used by our assets.
- Maximise our own and tenant recycling in our properties.
- Minimise the amount of waste created by our activities.
- Reduce our water usage wherever practicable.
- Increase the use of sustainable materials in our business.
- Enhance local employment and personal development opportunities arising from our contracts, including subcontractors.

#### We will improve on past performance by:

- Benchmarking the sustainability credentials of our significant suppliers.
- Developing a process that aims to measure the social, financial and environmental impact of our procurement choices in our key focus areas.
- Eliminating the procurement of single-use plastic products where possible.
